2017 Unguided Hunts

Overview

Unguided hunts are an option we provide for a limited number of hunters who have the experience and willingness to do a big game hunt themselves but do not have the gear or livestock to pull off a deep wilderness excursion. The camp we set up for unguided hunters is furnished with all camp necessities for a comfortable experience. The camp itself is set up in a nice meadow by Strawberry Creek in a productive hunting area. All you need to provide is your own provisions (food) for the hunt duration as well as your personal effects and of course hunting weapons.

The first day of your hunt your party will ride in with our packer to camp. We pack up your gear and provisions on mules and string them along as we take everyone and everything in on a 6 hour horseback ride into camp. It will take all day to get into camp. The packer will leave the next morning with all of the riding and pack stock. During your hunt your group is responsible for all camp chores and keeping the camp and equipment in a safe and clean condition. On the night before the last day of your hunt our packer will arrive with the pack stock and saddle horses in order to take you out of the mountains on the last day of your hunt.

Dates may move slightly as the hunts are confirmed. Please call with specific questions.

Deposits

We require a 33% deposit to confirm a hunt. We will hold reservations for about 1 week without a deposit. Deposits are non-refundable except in the following instances:

- The hunter experiences unforeseen serious personal medical issues prior to the trip. The deposit can be credited to the following year for a hunt of equal price and duration.
- The hunter does not receive a license in the event of a drawing for licenses. If this occurs, the hunter may have the deposit refunded or applied to a hunt the following year of equal price and duration.

What's included in an Unguided Hunt?

- Minimum 2, maximum of 4 hunters in camp. Unguided hunts are single party only.
- All equipment in camp including heated wall tents, axes, saws, cook stoves, kitchen prep and serving equipment, tables, benches, lanterns, lantern fuel, cots, latrine facilities
- Gear and provisions packed into/out of camp
- Saddle stock for hunters to ride into/out of camp
- Harvested, properly attended meat packed from camp out to trailhead and to meat processor.
- Trips duration includes one day riding into and one day riding out of camp

Additional Considerations:

On National Forest lands in Montana all food must either be in bear-proof containers or lifted out of reach of bears. There is a meat pole on the camp periphery, and we encourage and will provide for a nominal fee bear-proof food containers when we confirm final logistics for your hunt.

Camp chores including cutting firewood, getting water, mess hall duty, and keeping camp clean are the responsibility of your party.

Meat: Harvest, Field Prep and Transportation

Any animals harvested must be properly field dressed immediately and brought into camp as quickly as possible. This may include either boning the meat in the field or bring it in by quarters. We will discuss with you prior to departure your preferred method of field dressing the meat. It is very important that meat be taken care of as quickly as possible during the early season warm days, and also will go a long way to prevent predation of your meat from resident carnivores. We provide a satellite telephone for you to contact us if you have meat in camp. At that point we'll let you know when our packer will be coming by to take the meat out of camp. Our packers will not have time to retrieve meat from the field and bring it into camp for you.

2017 Big Game Seasons

- Early rifle season runs from 9/15 – 10/24

Montana Hunting Licenses

All licenses are allocated by drawing. License applications will be available in late January and must be received by the State by 3/15/2017. Prices and season dates will be finalized in early January 2017. Licenses may be purchased online at the following website: <http://fwp.mt.gov/hunting/licenses/availableLicenses.html> or by mail in application. We can assist the application process to assure it's correctly filled out.
